Dear Parent/Carer,

Back in September 2023, the Kaleidoscope Multi Academy Trust launched its new Behaviour Curriculum across all the schools. We are delighted to say that the curriculum has been implemented successfully and has now become part of the normal expectations in school.

Alongside a school's behaviour curriculum, we have implemented a new set of consequences which have now been embedded across the academy.

It is the aim of the academy to continuously improve across all aspects of the based on research and staff input. The behaviour team have carried out monitoring over the last 18 months and there are two areas that have been identified for improvement:

1. Presently, we contact parents when a red card is issued if it is felt that this is required to support a pupil's behaviour. Through monitoring of the yellow cards issued over the last 16 months, we have now decided that parents will be contacted after the second yellow card has been given in order to support the schools with pupil behaviour. This is to advise parents that their child's behaviour needs support before being escalated to the red card.
2. The red card consequence criteria will remain the same apart from one area. Currently racism behaviour requires a red card issued. At this stage, it can be because of misunderstanding of a word or phrase heard from somewhere else i.e. song, movie another older child. At this stage, a restorative conversation is held and work undertaken with the child to ensure that this is not repeated.

However, should the act of racism behaviour be repeated or targeted at another child/same child or intent is clearly shown then this becomes more serious as the pupil has not understood or learned from the red card. Therefore, we are adding a second tier of racism criteria in to the C5 – extremely serious tier. Racism behaviour will not be tolerated in any form across the Academy in line with our Equality policy.
